Meeting Minutes, February 6, 2015

HISTORY OF THE ROSE ENGINE

Our monthly mart started at 7:00 p.m. At 8:00 p.m., President Paul Martyn called the meeting to order. He thanked Ed Athey for refreshments. The minutes of last month were moved to be approved by Bob Linkenhoker and were seconded by Randy Ema, and approved by members.

UPCOMING EVENTS: Our Own Orange County Chapter 69 Goodtyme Mart is coming up very fast, and will be held this year on May 30th at same location as last year. Ventura Chapter will have it's mart on April 19th.

NEW BUSINESS: None

The program this month was a video entitled "History of the Rose Engine" and it was given by David Lindow. He said the Rose Engine has been used for centuries and Josiah Wedgewood used it in making his pottery. Ralph Lauren watches have rose engine designs and the Breguet Company built their own machinery. The "Guilloche" machine is shown in an ad for Ralph Lauren watches, but they are careful not to show any detail of it. Good machines come from Switzerland. David restored a 1913 machine, which had almost all of its parts, and it was from Switzerland.

History: Since the 1500's, Louis XVI was an engine turner. It was only sovereigns who "turned". They had to

keep their minds sharp, so it was like a religious duty. The gear teeth were set by prime numbers. Today's usage includes usage on dollar bills and stock certificates. There were intricate statues created in Italy which were taken to Kohlberg, Germany during the Thirty Years War. They are known as the Kohlberg Ivories, and they also include some portraits in ivory. In 2013, a single machine sold for \$238,000. Faberge used a rose engine on eggs. George Daniels used patterns in his watches. He has 30 pages in one of his books that are "invaluable". David developed a modern machine named 'MADE' (for Mike, Al, David and Ed) which they hope to make and sell 15 of them.

SHOW & TELL: LETTER 'T' or Mart Purchase:

Dave Weisbart showed us a Silas B. Terry "Chapel" model one to eight day clock with no suspension spring, dating from the 1870's.

Larry Squires showed us a Burnham Terry torsion clock which he tried to make a pendulum for it from a glass weight. He also showed a clock with a silver dial and 1910 rose engine work.

Jerry Kleeb showed us a torsion clock. The paint job is good on it. Post war clocks from 1950 or so precedes the "Schatz" name. It is a Schatz narrow plate clock which was made to avoid paying excise tax since the narrow plate counted as a watch.
