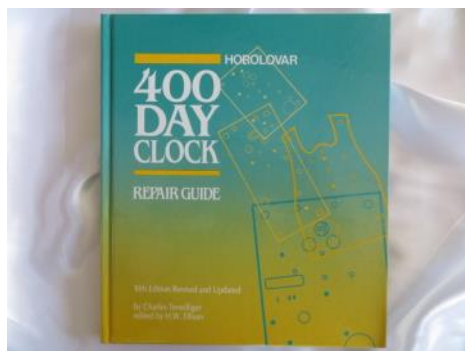

DAVE'S MUSICAL CLOCK

This month, Dave Weisbart will give us a sneak preview of the clock he is entering in the crafts competition at the National Convention in Chattanooga in June. It's a musical clock of his own design with at least one feature that is, to the best of his knowledge, unique in the world. (But you'll have to come to the meeting to find out what it is!)

This unique clock plays a classical melody on tuned aluminum chime rods every hour, and it strikes the hour as well. Dave did the design work on the computer, fabricated many parts himself, and outsourced others based on his design. (The wooden parts were made by our own former Chapter 69 member Leon Coufal!)

It has been a long haul for Dave getting this clock ready for the competition, and he has high hopes that it will bring home a ribbon. Come to the meeting and see what he's been up to!

Circa 1675 was a busy time for the pocket watch. The Spiral balance spring was introduced which allowed portable timepieces to be more accurate. The minute hand was subsequently introduced and the dial was divided into minutes. Around that same time, Charles II introduced long waistcoats and it became the fashion for men to carry their watch in a pocket instead of wearing it around their neck.

It has a 30 hour alarm with no strike. He also showed us a “U” for unusual clock, a 20th century one with a painted front and wooden plate which he got from the Internet.

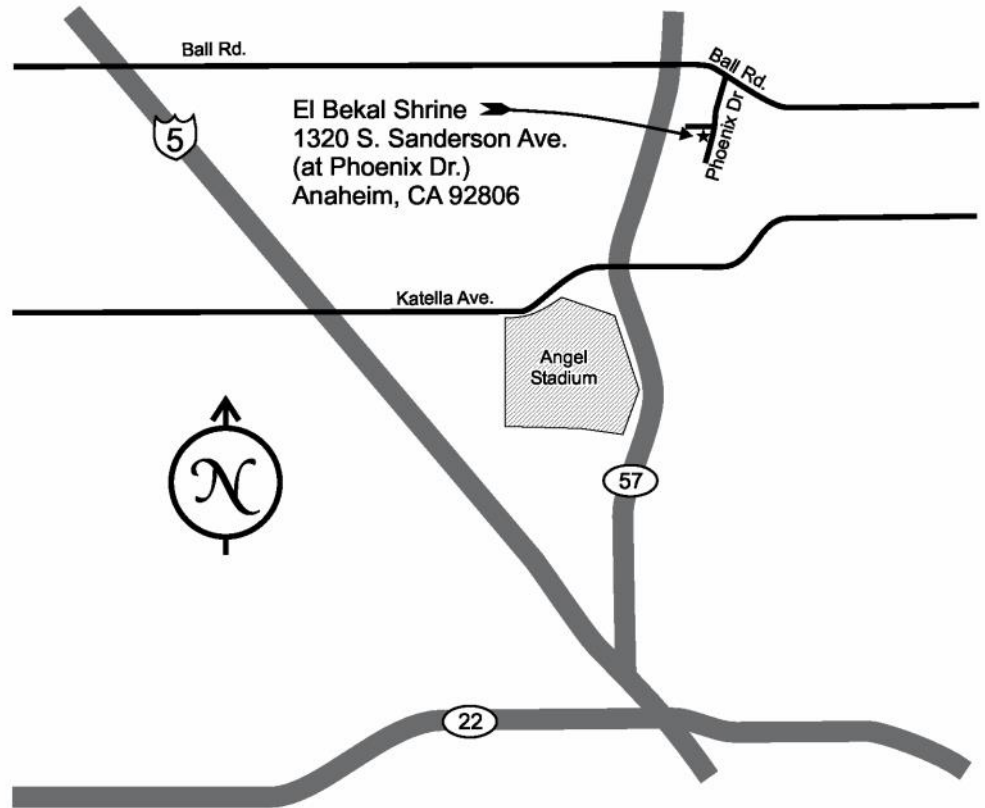
