TIME MACHINE: 1981 REGIONAL

them. Sally reported only 10 surveys have been returned, so fill one out by hand at the meeting or go online and do it. Thanks!

Tonight's program, a video on "Seth Thomas, a Unique way of doing business" by Ralph Pokluda. Seth Thomas started in Connecticut when Eli Terry went into business with the help of Seth Thomas and Chauncey Jerome. They manufactured 1 day and 8 day brass movement clocks, and after the War of 1812, shelf clocks. Through the years they manufactured pillar and scroll clocks, 1827; cheap brass movements in 1838, manufactured brass in his own factory, shipped to England after the 1842 depression ended, became incorporated in 1853. Seth Thomas died 11 days after he turned the company over to his son, in 1859. He introduced regulator clocks, mantel clocks, open offices across the United States, and opened a London office in the 1870's. He made tower clocks in 1873 and began making watches in the 1880's. The song "My Grandfather's Clock was in sync with making grandfather clocks in 1888. In the 1900's the company made Sonora chimes, steeple clocks for 40 years, tall case and electric clocks in 1928. In 1932, the family lost control of the company. Seth Thomas will always be remembered for making clocks that were superior but also inexpensive.

Show & Tell: Sally asks "what is guilding wire?" That is our homework for the next meeting. Phyllis Adams showed a clipping regarding how hours are calculated in the Bible, and a larger clipping from the LA Times featuring Dean Armentrout. Dave Weisbart commented that the article was originated by a LA Times reporter who was fascinated with the work Dave was doing repairing one of his clocks. Unfortunately he was not allowed to do the article on Dave, due to conflict of interest, so Dave generously suggested he contact Dean. Bob Linkenhoker showed us a Seth Thomas 15 day movement which has an odd beat of 16,200/hour. For the letter 'K', Doug Lynn showed a key wind, railroad, Waltham crescent pocket watch; a double key wind 1859 pocket watch that winds in the back; and a stem-wound Illinois transition Waltham that sets in the back. Paul Martyne showed a Seth Thomas 1939 mantel clock with Westminster Chimes. Doug Adams showed a Hamilton Model 22 chronometer in a wooden case which was made in San Pedro, says "US Army" and probably came from a lab. Les Lesovsky showed a 24 hour Bank Protection Company Seth Thomas which ran from dry cells and used a burglar alarms. Leon Coufel added he thinks it is made of 'padook' wood. Larry Squires showed a movement that came in many variations and the strangest one was made into a torsional clock. The raffle prizes were won by Larry Squires, Paul Martyn, and Les Lesovsky.


