Beginner's Corner: Paul Martyn discussed a French mantel clock with a mainspring barrel failure. The failure was not in the teeth. The gear train

was on but the barrel was distorted. Paul made a wood mandrel and beat it with a mallet. He repaired the bell with solder but then the bell wouldn't ring due to changes in the metal.



PROGRAM: Dave Weisbart presented tonight's program entitled "My Musical Clock". Because Dave is a musician, he is knowledgeable about articulation of notes. In musical clocks, everything rings at once. Dave wanted to make a musical clock with individual dampers for the chime rods, and he thought of using a "lyre" shape. He is using aluminum chime rods made of common aluminum. He found "The Clock Symphony" by Haydn and is using the fourth movement. Because of the movement overall strike timing, Dave had a total of 45 seconds for

This Month

"THE CLOCK"

This month, the main presentation will be an abbreviated showing of the movie "The Clock." Because the film is actually 24 hours in length, we will watch a few selected clips.

The movie was released in 2010 and is a montage of thousands of time-related scenes from numerous movies and are sequenced to form a 24-hour presentation. When played in its entirety, the movie corresponds to actual time, so that if the film clip has a watch showing 3:15 that will be the actual time you are viewing the film.

The Clock was produced by video artist Christian Marclay. There are reportedly only five copies of the movie in existence, one of which is owned by the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA). LACMA is scheduled to show extended versions portions of the movie between July 5 through September 7 and a full length, 24-hour showing on July 8 and July 25.

For our Beginner's Corner this month, Phyllis Adams will give a short unfinished presentation written by Doug on 'ATO' Clocks. She will also speak personally about how they got interested in timepieces.

TIME TRIVIA

Circa 1671 in London, William Clement began building clocks with the new "anchor" or "recoil" escapement, a substantial improvement over the verge because it interferes less with the motion of the pendulum.

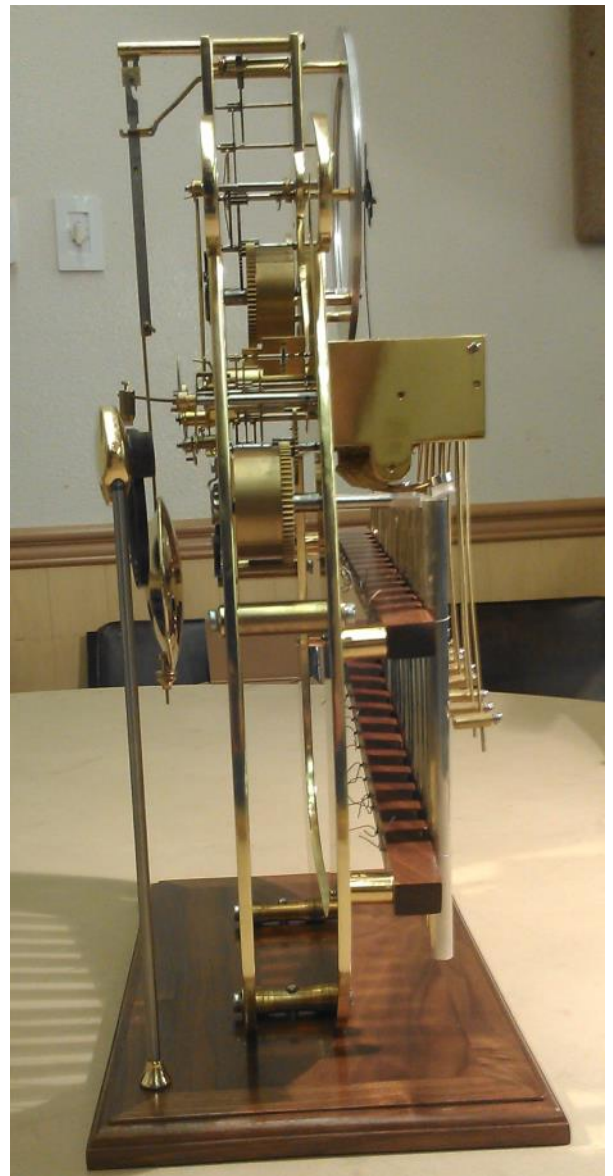

the music to run each hour. He is using Hermele movement chimes. He designed levers and connecting rods and he also designed the dampers to stop each note as needed. The dial on this clock looks great! Dave had the face professionally etched, and he melted black dial wax into the numerals on the dial himself. It is a skeleton clock, 8 day clock with a larger barrel. He has named the clock "Haydn in plain sight". (i.e. *hidin' in plain sight* for you non-musical members). He is entering it into the Craft competition at the National Convention this June, and we will all be rooting for this entry to win. He played the chimes for us and it was a delight to hear!



Show & Tell: Jerry Kleeb showed us a Hummel music box clock, 8 day, which plays on the hour. It was mentioned that Dean Armentrout will be featured on the Antiques Roadshow from Santa Clara.

The raffle prizes were won by Dave Weisbart, Randy Ema, and Annette DiMino.

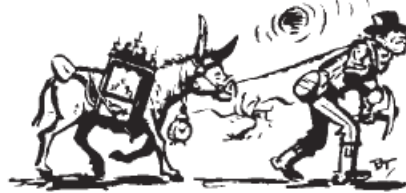


Dues are Due!
