Meeting Minutes, September 2, 2016

BLACK FOREST CLOCKS

The meeting was called to order by President Paul Martyn at 8:00 p.m. after our 7:00 p.m. mart ended. He thanked Ken Lynn for providing the refreshments tonight. The minutes for September will be approved next month.

UPCOMING EVENTS

Chapter 136 is having a 2 day mart in Vista on October 1st and 2nd at the Antique Steam Engine Museum. (There is also a steam engine and tractor show there on the 15th and 16th.)

Del Mar Regional is scheduled for October 13th, 14th and 15th.

Don't forget our Chapter 69 Bazaar will be held at our regular meeting place on October 7th. Set up time will be 6:45 p.m. Call Paul Martyn to reserve a table if you are a chapter member.

BEGINNER'S CORNER

Paul Martyn told us about his experience repairing with gold leaf. It works fine on pot metal but the liquid gold leaf won't work. If the item is too far gone, try the gold leaf. You can also use gold foil, but it is not made of gold, and does not work on 3D items. You should seal porous material first, following instructions according to the material but it is hard to put on. Then

a spray finish is needed. You have to lift up the material and it has a peel-off backing. Also gold leaf that applies with a brush will work but it is very thin and expensive. Dave Weisbart added that Krylon makes a pen-type applicator for gold.

TOOL TALK:

Paul Martyn brought 5 unknown metal tools for discussion. The first one was marked 7-87A and folds up to fit in your pocket. It might be a military number. He brought in two more tools, one might be for telephone relays and the other also for a telephone. The fourth one he showed was a flaring tool to hold copper wire, or possibly a split stick or to hold a hand. The fifth one was possibly an oiler, possibly homemade.

Jerry Kleeb brought in "hammerhead pliers" that are watchcase straighteners; pliers to remove dents from watchcases; pliers used to put a bow on a watch and then shape it "watch bow tool"; a device to set a bow which cuts a diameter on each side; and a set to measure how to set the pivots which figures out the middle hole. (a depthing tool or an uprighting tool.) This next one was from his father's workbench and no one was sure what it was. He showed another tool for setting roller jewels and pallet jewels using shellac.

Doug Lynn from "Dr. Frankenstein's office" brought in a Lineman's "butt set" from the 1920's, used to butt in on the line. He also showed us a multimeter with tube testing.

Members enjoyed discussing the mystery tools that were shown.

Bob Linkenhoker showed us "an old hunk of coal going to be a diamond someday" marked Welch, with marine escapement. He also had a second clock and asked how to get bubbles out of the wood finish? It was French but marked Imported from England.

Ellie showed us her "Fish clock" which has fish revolving around the perimeter. Phyllis Adams showed a stuffed animal Monkey clock and loud Scooby Doo alarm clock with food items as numerals. Dave Weisbart showed us his Ansonia Musical Alarm Carriage Clock which plays "God Save the Queen" or "My Country 'Tis of Thee" depending which side of the ocean you are on. He said "beauty is only skin deep" and we understood this after hearing the clock. Doug Lynn provided a metal "Ugly Clock" award and members voted Bob's marine escapement clock was the winner.


SHOW & TELL


